This is the 12th year of Open Studios North Fife. From award winning ceramicists and painters to jewellers, weavers and textile artists, and those working in glass, metal, wood, photography and pencil – we have them all.

Open Studios North Fife was set up in 2005 to promote the wealth of talent of professional artists and makers in the area. We started with 14 people and now number over 70.

Keep this brochure for future reference. Many of the artists welcome visits to their studios throughout the year.

As Artists and Craftspeople we manage our studios and our careers in lots of different ways. Some of us sell our work close to home and others also supply international markets. Some make multiples to specific designs while others are commissioned for bespoke pieces or create one-off paintings and sculpture.

The scale we work on varies too. Ranging from small intimate pieces to large architectural installations. But what we all

have in common is the strong drive to make our own work and a real passion for the materials we use.

We hope you find visiting our studios inspiring and that it will give you an interesting insight into our unique way of life.

You'll find clusters of studios only minutes apart and single studios in more rural locations worth going to for the views as well as the work on show! We have provided maps and directions for each studio but if you are not familiar with the area you might want to bring a road map.

You may notice that some other groups and individuals choose to hold exhibitions on the same weekend as Open Studios North Fife and sometimes use similar signage. You will be able to identify open studio artists who have paid the participation fee which funds

Directions: No. 200 is on the North side of the High Street, halfway between the Tower Bakery and the west end of the street. Come down the passage to the yard, the studio is inside the house on your right.

Access: There is unrestricted parking in the High Street, or in the west car park above the bowling green. Access to the studio is up 3 steps.

Points of Interest: Mugdrum Park, just below the west car park, has picnic tables, the start of the Fife Coastal Path and a fine view of the Firth of Tay and the Sidlaw Hills. At the bottom of the park is a good play area with swings, slides and climbing structures.
